Jack Bush made a return on his opwn to win the MTBO with 20 checkpoints visited. Melissa Everingham was out female winner visiting 15 checkpoints within her time.





Our winning female in the Trail event was Rosemary Hurford with 10 checkpoints visited. Rosemary finished in exactly the same time as our Male finisher Damien Hersey in 2h02m36s who was the only one to visit 13 checkpoints.

There was a strong field in the Long event with Michael Krajewski on his new Gravel bike coming out on top visiting 26 checkpoints and finishing 10 minutes early. A number of you under estimated the speed of the bike course and found yourselves finishing early having cleared the bike course. Super well done to Hannah Cooke who was our winning female just 2 checkpoints behind Michael and within the time. The pairs was close with 2 pairs finishing on 220 points, but Andrew Cawthorne and David Birell finished a minute and a half ahead of the Murpheys.

In the Short event, Nige Davison was our first solo visiting 9 checkpoints within the 2 hours. His performance was bettered by the pairing of Andy and Karen Jones to maintain their winning streak by visiting 11 checkpoints, picking up a couple of penalty points for being 42 seconds late.
